The Bears and the Eagles have been very busy practising all of our sounds in phonics, we



have moved into our new phonics groups where have lots of opportunities to read and

write. The teachers are so impressed with the number of children who now read regularly at home, it's great to see our new phonics reading books being used so that children can practise blending. Thank you to the grown-ups who put this effort in every day it makes such a positive impact on your child's learning.

In maths we have had a number focus. We have been using the Numicon and finding out which numbers go together to make five. We have also been looking at different patterns and creating our own patterns by using different equipment in the classroom. We sat with the children individually and worked through some maths challenges together and we were super impressed with their knowledge and skills, we have some marvellous mathematicians in Foundation Stage!

We really enjoyed the warmer weather last week! It has been nice to get outside and explore the new things in our outdoor area such as the climbing frame and the book corner. When it is a warm day please could grown-ups send their children to school with a sun hat, we all want to stay sun safe in school and this will help us to do so. We hope it is warm for our trip to the farm!

As always, we have been focussing on how we can use our 6R's in school every day. We encourage the children to show respect to everything and everyone in the classroom, to take responsibility for themselves and their actions and to try hard to be resilient when solving their problems. We are so proud of them for this and we know it is being encouraged at home too!







The children in Year 1 have been busy bees this term and have adapted to a continuous provision style of learning. We have been completing a wide range of activities over the last few weeks that have focused on areas such as History, Science, Art and DT. We have learnt all about the past and how transport has changed.

We learnt all about Florence Nightingale and even discussed real life heroes today such as Nurses, Scientists, Firemen and Police officers! We all met a real Police officer and asked him questions about his job and had a look at his uniform and equipment.

We have also been continuously using our metacognition to retrieve everything we had learnt on classifying animals and developed our understanding further by learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. As you can see, we have been working super hard to build our brains full of so much exciting knowledge and skills!

Responsibility



Year 2 have had a very busy term! We have been exploring lots of new and exciting concepts and taking in lots of new knowledge.



In maths, fractions and shapes have been our focus and we have produced some fantastic work in our books and through practical activities such as using playdoh to build a variety of 3-D shapes!



We are all trying to improve our writing here in year 2, so we have been writing our own poem inspired by

"There's a rang-tan in my room" and our own short story based on the book "Somebody Swallowed Stanley". We absolutely loved learning how features such as similes and adventurous vocabulary can make our writing so much more exciting! We all performed our poems to each other when they were complete.



Year 2 have also been enjoying exploring different mediums in art. They used clay to make turtles to link to our topic 'Protecting Planet Earth'

The children reflected on the clay 'dragon eyes' from our Autumn Term and learned a new skill of using clay slip and scoring to stick the pieces to the body of the turtle.









Our walk around the village was great fun. Everyone was so well behaved and we managed to spot lots of changes to Birstall over time. Have you ever noticed the years in bricks on some of the buildings? We found some!











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
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In English this half-term, we have been looking at a variety of different texts. We have been focusing on the Roald Dhal book, 'Billy and the Minpins'. The children have completed a lot of work based around this story and ended the unit by creating their own story using the story line that they have read.

In Maths, we have been working on fractions. Children have been developing their understanding that fractions have equal parts, the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and how to find a fraction of a number. They have also developed their knowledge of what numerators and denominators represent.

In Science, we have been investigating plants. We have been able to plant peas in the garden outside of our classroom which was a lovely activity for the children to engage in. We have looked at the different parts of plants, what their functions are and what a plant needs in order to survive.





In Music, the children have continued to develop their understanding of the Steel Pan Drums and have been learning a song from memory. The children have really been enjoying these sessions which have been delivered by a professional music teacher. The children from both classes will have the opportunity to showcase their newly learnt music skills to children from KS1 which will no doubt be an enjoyable experience for them!

Within PE, children have been developing their fine motor skills and learning the rules and skills of tennis. Children have just started 'Character Award' with Miss Burton and will be developing teamwork, resilience and perseverance skills.

Finally, in Design Technology, the children have been working on creating a patchwork quilt and learning new sewing skills. These are not quite finished yet, but we will love being able to show you our results when we have completed them.



Year 4 have had another amazing term, learning lots of new things across the

curriculum.

In English, we spent a lot of time perfecting our instruction writing skills. This including making our very own pizzas (from scratch) and then writing a set of instructions on how others can do the same. This involved measuring ingredients, cutting and preparing toppings, following instructions carefully as well as a wealth of other skills. Each child made their own

pizza to take home.







In science, we have completed our topic on forces, learning about frictions and the way different materials impact some forces. We have also studied magnets, and investigated which materials are magnetic. As part of science week, we went down to our forest school area and planted onion seeds. This involved turning the soil, preparing the area by removing branches and weeds and then planting and watering these seeds.

Year 4 have continued to do very well with computing this term, learning more about how the internet works. We have been studying Christianity, and looking specifically at key days for Christians leading up to and including Easter in R.E.

Character Award is something we are loving in Year 4, where we have continued our knowledge of first aid, as well as developed a range of character muscles. This links closely with our PSHE topic, where we have also looked at first aid, as well as other important areas like feelings and how to manage and express our emotions.

The Spring term has been a fun and successful term for Year 4 and we are equally looking forward to the Summer term.

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

SCIENCE AMBASSADORS




MATHS AMBASSADORS CHALLENGE
