PERSONAL, SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

This term the pupils will be learning about Riverside's 6R's. Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reflection and Reciprocity.

Key Vocabulary: Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reflection and Reciprocity.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

This term the pupils will be developing their spatial awareness within their PE lessons. They will be learning about space and moving around in different ways. Our PE day will be **Friday**!!

Key Vocabulary: body, move, space, run, jump, skip,

LITERACY, COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

This term the pupils will be developing their speaking and listening skills through exciting phonics lessons and activities. We will be starting to learn how to read, write and say new sounds.

Key Vocabulary: listen, discuss, share, ask, answer, idea, vocabulary, comment

MATHEMATICS

This term the pupils will be focusing on three topics within mathematics: Matching and sorting, Pattern and Positional language.

Key Vocabulary: match, sort, find, pattern, shape, repeat, turn, next, colour, next to, on, under, above, in between, besides, in front of, behind, pair

EXPRESSIVE ARTS & DESIGN

This term the pupils will be exploring and using a range of mark making tools. They will also be creating self-portraits and portraits of others using inspiration from famous artists

Key Vocabulary: crayon, chalk, felt, marks, pattern, texture, portrait

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

This term our topic is 'All About Me' and the children will be learning about their own body and exploring their senses to investigate the world around them.

Key Vocabulary: body, label, senses, head, arm, leg, tummy, shoulders, feet, toes, fingers, elbow, knees, eyes, ears, mouth, nose, sight, touch, smell, taste, hear
