

Year 5 Summer Term Curriculum Maps



MATHS

Year 5 will study Perimeter and Area, Statistics, Geometry and Measurement within maths throughout the summer term. Children will continue to learn and develop their mathematical skills including reasoning and problem solving. facts.

Key vocabulary – degrees, angles, coordinates, symmetry, conversions, metric and imperial units.

HISTORY

This term, children will be learning about the early Islamic civilisation. Year 5 will be exploring how Islam began, life in Baghdad in the Golden Age and the achievements of the early civilisation that we still see today. **Key Vocabulary** – Islam, Muslim, civilisation, reign.

COMPUTING

Children will be exploring physical computing through the use of programming and learning how to use crumbles. In addition to this, pupils will develop their programming skills through designing and coding an interactive quiz. **Key Vocabulary** – crumbles, components, repetition, selection, conditions, flow diagrams

ENGLISH

In the Summer term, we will be focusing on two new texts; Flotsam and The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe. Year 5 will have numerous opportunities to showcase their skills through writing texts such as diary entries, narratives and poems. **Key Vocabulary** – parenthesis, semicolon, colons

GEOGRAPHY

Children will be learning about mountain ranges across the world and the key features of a river. Year 5 will also be locating rivers and deserts across the world using a map.

Key Vocabulary – course, mountain range, summit, desert, river, flow, physical features, locate, map.

MUSIC

Pupils will be exploring a variety of musical styles to help them understand how music could shape and support their lives. Pupils will do this through words, meaning and expression to find connections between musical and social themes. **Key Vocabulary:** Listening, Singing, Improvising, Composing and Performing

SCIENCE

Living Things and Their Habitats – Children will be exploring the life cycle of plants, the reproduction of both plants and animals and comparing the work of a naturalist and animal behaviourist. Animals Including Humans – Children will learn

about gestation periods of different animals and compare this to humans.

PE

Throughout the term, children will be developing their athletic skills, learning how to play invasion games such as tag rugby, rounders and consolidate their dance skills that they have already learnt in the Autumn term.

Key Vocabulary: core strength, agility, teamwork

SMSC/RE/RHE

Pupils will develop their knowledge and understanding of Christianity and how Christians live through the teaching and examples of Jesus. Pupils will also explore what matters most to Humanists and explain the connections between these. **Key Vocabulary** – Parables, Disciples, Sermon,

Gospel, Humanist, Genesis, Morals.
