

Year 4 Spring Term Curriculum Maps



MATHS

Children will continue to learn multiplication facts. They will study division, area, fractions and decimals.

We will also be doing lots of times table practice up to the 12 times tables.

Key vocabulary: decimals, area, fractions

SMSC/RE/RHE

PSHE – We will be focussing on being able to administer simple first aid.

RE – We will be looking at 'The Holy Week' such as Good Friday and the last supper.

Key Vocabulary – Easter, symbols, prayer, Gospel, Palm cross, salvation

ENGLISH

We will be focusing on the texts 'The miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' and 'Fizzlebert Stump'. Over this term, the children will learn about different genres of writing: information texts and poetry, narratives, letters and diary entries.

Key vocabulary: verses, rhyme, scheme, technical language

GEOGRAPHY

We will be looking at OS maps, what they are used for and the children will then be using them to find certain places.

As well as this, they will be able to use and read coordinates

Key Vocabulary – Key, ordnance survey, map, coordinates, references

We will be developing our understanding of how digital images can be changed and edited and how they can be resaved and reused.

ICT

Key Vocabulary – image, edit, arrange, select, crop, copyright

HISTORY

Children will learn about the Anglo Saxons and will be able to explain how life in Britain changed as a result of the Anglo-Saxon invasions.

We will look at where they lived and what jobs they did.

Key Vocabulary – raiders, invasion, conquer, Anglo Saxon, chronicle, converted

SCIENCE

Electricity & forces

The children will be learning about electricity and forces over this term. They will be investigating and carrying out experiments and creating our own circuits as well as looking at magnetic forces.

Key vocabulary: circuits, battery, circuit, conductor

PE

Tag rugby. – It is a non-contact version of rugby, in which each player wears a special belt that has two tags attached to it and instead of being tackled, a player carrying the ball can be 'tagged' by having a tag removed from their belt.

Gymnastics: – children will be learning different, rolls, balances and ways to travel.

Key Vocabulary – roll, tuck, jump, attack, defend, pass, agility, spatial awareness

Music

Children will be focussing on music around the theme 'how does music improve our world?' through purpose, identity and expression.

Key Vocabulary – semibreve, doted crochet, pentatonic scale, treble clef
