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The children in Year 1 have been the best ECO warriors we have seen this year! Because we have been learning in science and geography all about the world and plants. We did our very own plant hunt too and



ticked off any that we saw.





We have also been lucky to go on an awesome school trip to Brocks Hill where we also put our science knowledge to the test by identifying deciduous and evergreen trees on our nature trail. We thoroughly enjoyed our pond dipping session where we looked closely at what living creatures live in ponds and how to spot them. We got our hands dirty and worked on our team work skills by planning and building dens in groups. The children shown so much determination, enthusiasm and confidence! We have been learning all about 'The Great Fire of London' and they have enjoyed role playing different events as well as creating some brilliant London Skyline pictures using pastels and paint.

They have also enjoyed making their own vehicles. The children had to design and plan which vehicle they would make, making sure the body of the vehicle clearly represented what it was. They then had to decorate their vehicles and add the wheels and axles onto it, making sure each vehicle could move.







In Geography we have been looking at towns, cities and villages and they children once again showed off what they had learnt and designed their own villages outside in chalk. The children were all able to say what features they would in a village!

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This term Year 3's topic has been 'Natural Disasters'. We have looked at a variety of different natural disasters including volcanoes and earthquakes and their effects on humans and the world. Within Maths, we have worked on telling the time, shape, fractions and mass and capacity. In our Science lessons we have been focusing on 'rocks, soils and fossils'. We have recently moved onto 'states of matter'.

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This term, Year 5 have been exploring the world we live in during our topic 'Life All Around Us'. The children thoroughly enjoyed our English book 'Flotsam' which to their surprise was a picture book! We created some fantastic narratives that we based on the inferences we made from the images in the book.

In Art, we have been looking at Early Islamic art and even had a go at creating our own! Year 5 reflected carefully and made decisions on which colours to use using colour theories.

We recently took a trip to Watermead as part of our Geography topic where we investigated the flow of a river, conducted a litter audit and explored the beautiful place that surrounds our school.
