

Year 4 Summer Term Curriculum Maps



MATHS

Children will continue to learn multiplication facts as well as decimals. They will also develop their learning of money and time.

We will also be doing lots of times table practice up to the 12 times tables.

Key vocabulary: decimals, convert, hour, minute

SMSC/RE/RHE

PSHE – We will be focussing on how our choices can affect the environment and how they can respond to peer pressure.

RE – We will be looking at how different religions mark milestones in life and how a person's religion can impact on peoples' life journey.

Key Vocabulary – Pentecost, kingdom of God, Bible, Rights, consent, risk

ICT

We will be developing our understanding of gathering data and how this is used to collate information as well as using digital devices to record sound.

Key Vocabulary – Data, data set, data table, question, senses, sensor, temperature, light, sound, data logger

ENGLISH

We will be focusing on **traditional Indian tales** and be focussing on writing to persuade as well as creating character descriptions, writing diary entries and formal letters

Key vocabulary: formal, vocabulary, persuade, discussion, explanation

GEOGRAPHY

We will be looking at maps and will be learning how to locate India as well as focussing on the geographical facts as well as physical features of India

Key Vocabulary – geographical, Latitude Longitude, Equator, Northern and Southern Hemisphere, Mountains, Rivers

HISTORY

Children will learn about the Indus Valley civilisation and looking at what life and the buildings would have been like. They will also be looking at artefacts and specific events in History.

Key Vocabulary – Valley, civilisation, BC, Pakistan, archaeologist, discovery, settlement, condition artefact, examine, primary source, Indus script, ruins,

SCIENCE

Living things and their habitats

The children will be learning about the different types of trees and how living things can be classified as well as learning about the environmental dangers to endangered species.

Key vocabulary: invertebrates, endangered, classification

PE

Athletics. – To run, jump and throw individually as well as combined such as a long jump.

Invasion games – To work collaboratively to use basic tactics for defending and attacking

Key Vocabulary – Batting, fielding, bowling, bat, wicket, stumps, Control, use space, defend, attack, chest pass, tactics

Music

Children will be focussing on music with the theme 'How does music shape our way of life'

Key Vocabulary – semibreve, dotted crotchet, 2/4, 3/4, 4/4 metre, legato, staccato, pentatonic scale, stave, treble clef, time signature, harmony
